The street was reimproved, and widened for a considerable distance, in 1914, at a cost of 135, 000. New Thoroughfares. The construction of new thoroughfares in various sections of the city was urgently required in order to relieve congestion of traffic on existing streets and to afford shorter and better intercommunication between various districts. This was accomplished by the grading, paving and curbing of new streets, by opening new traffic arteries, by utilizing streets which have in some cases been widened and extended, and by constructing bridges. One of the chief improvements of this nature was the opening up of the Baum Boulevard, Center Avenue, a parallel street, having been congested with traffic from the Grant Boulevard.
